MAY 22, 2014

P361-14 COUNCILLOR GOULD - MOVE TO receive and approve the minutes from the last regular meeting of May 8, 2014. (Unanimous)

P362-14 COUNCILLOR GOULD – MOVE TO receive, under suspension of the rules, Item 8-K communication from John Soares, Firefighter, Peabody Fire Department, regarding Requesting relief from Section 26-15 of the City Code to hold a “boot drive.” (Unanimous)

REASONS FOR DENIAL STATED BY COUNCILLOR JOEL D. SASLAW:

1. All abutters are overwhelmingly in opposition to the billboards;
2. The billboards are not accessible by road;
3. The impact could drastically affect residents property values; and
4. The billboard does not meet MassDOT requirements for new permits under 3.07(b) "The area in which the sign is to be located is not predominantly residential, agricultural, or open space or natural area."

By amending Section 11.6.2 Applicability by enacting a zoning moratorium on billboards as follows:

AFTER THE DATE OF ADOPTION BY THE PEABODY CITY COUNCIL, NO SPECIAL PERMIT APPLICATION FOR A BILLBOARD SHALL BE ACCEPTED BY THE CITY OF PEABODY FOR A SPECIFIC PERIOD OF TIME WHICH SHALL COMMENCE AT THE TIME OF SAID ADOPTION AND REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR A PERIOD OF 24 MONTHS.

SECTION TWO: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION THREE: This ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.
